This Day in the Civil War: May 28th

1861: Secretary of War Simon Cameron meets with Dorothea Dix and accepts her offer to set up hospitals for the Union Army.

1862: Skirmishing at the South Anna River in Virginia. Union troops burn a 500 ft bridge, and will now capture the nearby town of Ashland.

1863: A regiment of African American soldiers, the 54th Mass Volunteers, leaves Boston. They will train at Hilton Head SC.

1864: Lee's Army of Northern VA moves towards Cold Harbor, as Grant's forces cross the Pamunkey River near Hanovertown

1865: President Andrew Johnson, with only a few exceptions, orders the release of persons held in prison by Federal military authorities

Person of the Month: Salmon Chase

Background

- Like his New Hampshire ancestors, a New England Puritan to the core.
- A man not easy to like, but to be trusted and respected always.
- Named after ancestor of King David in the Bible, not after the fish.
- Had a distinguished political career: Governor of Ohio, US Senator
- Sought Republican party President nomination in 1860. Unlike Lincoln, Chase was not a politician by temperament

Civil War

- Served in Lincoln's Cabinet as Secretary of the Treasury
- Realized massive amount of money needed to maintain the army
- Until Congress could authorize new taxes and tariffs, swiftly arranged a series of loans from Northern banks and private individuals
- Got Congress to cooperate in establishing a new national paper currency, "greenbacks," and a national bank system based on this.
- For the duration of the war, the US government suspended in exchange of paper money for gold or silver to finance the Union war effort
- Congress limited the issue of paper money to \$340 million; In contrast, the Confederacy suffered ruinous inflation.
- Chase financed much of Union war effort by recruiting Jay Cooke & Co to sell over \$500 million war bonds; had the effect of distributing the war cost over part of the US population
- Was unhappy as Treasury Secretary; little respect for Lincoln; Lincoln realized Chase's true abilities, better than Chase himself did.

Post-Civil War

- After the Civil War became Chief Justice of the US Supreme Court
- Even though he was not affiliated with any bank, a national bank that's still around today indeed named in honor of Salmon Chase
