This Day in the Civil War: October 30th

- 1861: Lincoln accepts Genl Winfield Scott retirement; George McClellan is named General-in-Chief of the Army In Morgantown, KY, Union troops successfully withstand attack by Confederate forces.
- 1862: Union troops gather at Grand Junction, TN in preparation for the upcoming campaign against Vicksburg.
- 1863: Federal steamship Chattanooga arrives at besieged Chattanooga, TN with 40k food rations & tons of feed for animals
- 1864: Nevada becomes the 36th state. In the upcoming Presidential election, solidly Republican NV will contribute 3 electoral votes.

Person of the Month: Dr. Jonathan Letterman

- Medical Director of the Union Army of the Potomac
- Revolutionized medical treatment practices employed by the Union Army during the Civil War
- Focused on improving treatment of wounds and ensuring that medical facilities and staff had adequate supplies
- Dramatically improved the ambulance and hospital processes
