Gettysburg National Cemetery

- Originally called Soldiers' National Cemetery, President Abraham Lincoln delivered his Gettysburg Address at the cemetery's consecration on November 19, 1863
- That day is observed annually at the cemetery and in the town as "Remembrance Day" with a parade, procession, and memorial ceremonies by thousands of Civil War reenactor troops representing both Union and Confederate armies and descendant heritage organizations led by the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) and the Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV).
- Cemetery contains 3,512 interments from the Civil War, including the graves of 979 unknowns
- Also has sections for veterans of Spanish American War, World War I, and other wars, along with graves of the veterans' spouses and children. The total number of interments exceeds 6,000

Civil War Almanac This Day in the Civil War History: July 25 Cancelled

Subject of the Month: David Stockton McDougal (Mark Costin) <u>Before the Civil War</u>

- Born September 27, 1809, in Ohio
- Appointed as a midshipman on April 1, 1828
- Served in Mediterranean, West Indian, and Home Squadrons as well as on the Great Lakes in Michigan
- Served on USS Mississippi from 1846 to 1848, during Mexican American War
- Participated in blockade and siege of Veracruz
- Commanded the sloop-of-war USS Warren from 1854 to 1856
- Commanded the steam tug USS John Hancock in 1856

During the Civil War

- David Stockton McDougal was Commander of the screw sloop USS Wyoming from 1861 to 1864
- Most significant action was the July 16, 1863, naval Battle of Shimonoseki Strait
